She said to Jesus, "You are a Jew, and I am a Samaritan woman. Why are You asking me for a drink?" 13Jesus replied, "People soon become thirsty again after drinking this water. 14But the water I give them

takes away thirst altogether. It becomes a perpetual spring within them, giving them eternal life." 16"Go and get your husband," Jesus told her. 17"I don't have a husband," the woman replied. Jesus said, "You're right! You don't have a husband— 18 for you have had five husbands, and you aren't even married to the man you're living with now." 19"Sir," the woman said, "You must be a prophet. 20 So tell me, why is it that You Jews insist that Jerusalem is the only place of worship, while we Samaritans claim it is here at Mount Gerizim, where our ancestors worshiped?" ²⁵The woman said, "I know the Messiah will come—the one who is called Christ. When He comes, He will explain everything to us." ²⁶Then Jesus told her, "I am the Messiah"! ...²⁸The woman left her water jar beside the well and went back to the village and told everyone, ²⁹"Come and meet a man who told me everything I ever did! Can this be the Messiah?" 31 Meanwhile, the disciples were urging Jesus to eat. ³²"No," He said, "I have food you don't know about." ³³"Who brought it to Him?" the disciples asked each other. 34Then Jesus explained: "My nourishment comes from doing the will of God... Look around you! Vast fields are ripening all around us and are ready now for the harvest... the fruit they harvest is people brought to eternal life. What joy awaits both the planter and the harvester alike!"

2 Corinthians 11:21-31 NLT

¹ I'm ashamed to say that we've been too "weak" to do that! But whatever they dare to boast about—I'm talking like a fool again—I dare to boast about it, too. 22 Are they Hebrews? So am I. Are they Israelites? So am I. Are they descendants of Abraham? So am I. 23 Are they servants of Christ? I know I sound like a madman, but I have served him far more! I have worked harder, been put in prison more often, been whipped times without number, and faced death again and again. 24 Five different times the Jewish leaders gave me thirty-nine lashes. 25 Three times I was beaten with rods.
